authorize the Macomb County Community Services Agency to receive funds from the Area
Agency on Aging 1-B to operate the Senior Citizens Chore Program for program year 2010-11.

INTRODUCED BY: Commissioner Carey Torrice, Chair Public Services Committee

Background:

The Chore program assists senior citizens with home maintenance and minor repairs. The program is available to persons age 60 and older, who are residents of Macomb County and meet eligibility guidelines.

Funding Amount:

This is the second year of a three-year (3) grant period. Our grant funding request is \$83,998. Last year we received the same level of funding.

Period of Performance:

October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011
(No County Match Required)

Funding Utilization

With the total funds received, we are projecting to serve 550 customers by providing 6,500 units (hours) of service. Typical job requests include: minor plumbing, changing storms and screens, minor electrical, gutter cleaning, changing furnace filters, replacing locks, etc. Seasonal type services include grass cutting and snow removal.

for Southeastern Michigan to provide food to low-income families in targeted school districts.

Background

MCCSA's Food Program applied for and was successfully awarded \$80,000 from the Kresge Foundation through United Way for Southeastern Michigan (UWSEM) to provide food to those in need in Macomb County.

Grant Period: Funds must be expended by December 31, 2010
(MCCSA received award notice on May 13, 2010)

Funding Amount: \$80,000
(No County match required)

Funding Utilization

The Kresge Food Grant was awarded to the Macomb County Community Services Agency's Macomb Food Program for the purpose of providing supplementary packaged food to families and individuals residing in the targeted schools districts of Van Dyke, Clintondale, Mt. Clemens, Fitzgerald and New Haven.

The Macomb Food Program will utilize the funds to purchase pre-packed pantry packs that provide twenty (20) meals each from Gleaners Community Food Bank. The pantry packs will be distributed to the households residing in the five (5) targeted areas from established food pantries of the Macomb Food Program.

Customer Eligibility Requirements

Eligibility is based on residency in one of the five (5) targeted public school districts.

Weatherization Assistance Program funds.

Background

Per the Michigan Department of Energy (DOE) American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) State Plan, approximately \$31 million dollars was set aside for future distribution. The State will award via an Intent to Bid process for a statewide multi-family unit project in the near future. The remaining funding, as well as some other unspent funding, will be distributed to several Community Action Agencies. The criteria used to determine which agencies would receive the additional funding was the Agency's recent survey response, the Agency's production to date and the commitment by each Agency to meet or exceed the 30% production goals distributed to the network as part of the survey process.

Grant Period: April 1, 2009 through March 31, 2012

Funding Amount: \$615,000 (Additional funding)
Original Allocation is: \$8,127,986 (No County match required)

Funding Utilization

The funding available would allow us to complete an additional 90 dwellings. However, with the acceptance of these additional funds, 421 dwellings must be completed by August 1, 2010. The total number of dwellings increased to 1,256. Production goals will be prioritized to specific income levels and special populations. Of the 1,256 dwellings, production will include at least:

- 252 (20%) elderly dwellings;
- 189 (15%) handicapped dwellings; and
- 314 (25%) Department of Human Services Program referrals (which include food stamp, state disability assistance, or supplemental security income recipients).

A maximum average unit cost of \$6,500 must be maintained. We will continue to leverage additional resources through coordination with community organizations and local landlords.

Customer Eligibility Requirements

A dwelling unit shall be eligible for assistance if the individual/household:

1. Income is at or below 200% of the poverty level established by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, or at or below 60% of the state median income, whichever is higher, or
2. Has received at any time during the twelve (12) month period preceding the date of application for weatherization assistance:
 - Cash assistance payments under Title IV (FIP) or XVI of the Social Security Act (SSI), or
 - State Disability Assistance, or
3. Is a qualified rental dwelling unit in accordance with Community Services Policy Manual Item 608.
(For example, a family of four's (4) total household income cannot exceed \$44,112)
